PROGRESSIVE CHRISTIANITY

The Progressive Christianity Class will begin on August 21 with a DVD series titled "Violence Divine," which includes refutation by John Dominic Crossan. We have increased our class time to allow for ample discussion of his view of "Redemptive Violence" or the question, "Does God ever call us to violence?" Considering the racial, gun, ethnic, religious and sexual violence erupting in our country today, this is a most timely topic. Crossan is an Irish-American New Testament scholar, historian of early Christianity, and former Catholic priest who has produced both scholarly and popular works. His research has focused on the historical Jesus, and on the anthropology of the ancient Mediterranean and New Testament worlds.

CHALLENGERS CLASS

Why adult Sunday School? Some people feel that adult Sunday School is not necessary in the modern world – that we need to think about God only when we have trouble. If that is true, we need God more than ever at this moment. Trouble is everywhere and politics and logic are giving us few answers. The Challengers Class main purpose is to use the teachings of Jesus to deal with today's world. Christ taught us to love, forgive and judge not. This is as meaningful today as it was 2000 years ago.

We invite you to join us on Sundays at 10:00 a.m. in the beautifully redecorated Room 205 to discuss Jesus and the Bible and their place in our lives.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Mentoring is something we associate in the business world. A vice-president recognizes special traits of a younger employee and counsels him/her for preparation to advance in the organization. 
