#### What Can't Wait

We are back at the beginning once again. Advent is upon us, and every year we seem to need it more than the last. Advent is my favorite time of the church year because I believe that relentless hope is the jet fuel of transformative spiritual growth. Deep change is not fueled by self-flagellation but by a prophetic imagination that proclaims the future can be different than the present. The violence, greed, despair and fear that dominate our present world is not our destiny. God has something better in store for us all, and I cannot wait for that future to come.

One of the great Advent hymns is Charles Wesley's *Come Thou Long Expected Jesus*, which begins, "Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; from our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in thee." Jesus comes into our world not to bring fear and punishment but

freedom, release and rest. This year I would rather have what he is bringing than a new watch. Speaking to God, St. Augustine famously said, "Our hearts are restless until they find their rest in thee." Advent is the season for those whose restless longings cannot be satisfied by presents or parties. God alone satisfies, and God's dreams are not just for a select few but for all. Advent hope insists that God's future is breaking into our world now.

During this Advent season, we are following the theme, "What Can't Wait" from A Sanctified Art. This is how they explain this year's theme:

Advent is a season of waiting, but is idle waiting what God wants of us? In preparation for the coming Messiah, we wonder together—what things can't wait? What demands our immediate attention? What requires our work and preparation? What is it that God can't wait for? Is it our praise, reconciliation, and proclamation? Is it the end of suffering, isolation, and fear? This Advent, we invite you to join us in imagining, prioritizing, and preparing. As we wait, what can't?

With a daily devotional, original artwork, poetry and prayers, we will follow this theme through Advent into Christmas. I hope you will join us in worship and utilize the resources we make available, so that you might be a part of God's promised future being made visible here and now.
